*Reader : A Reading from the Word of God written in Genesis 22:1-14*

After these things God tested Abraham. He said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." 2. He said, "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains that I shall show you." 3. So Abraham rose early in the morning, saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and his son Isaac; he cut the wood for the burnt offering, and set out and went to the place in the distance that God had shown him. 4. On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place far away. 5. Then Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the boy and I will go over there; we will worship, and then we will come back to you." 6. Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on his son Isaac, and he himself carried the fire and the knife. So the two of them walked on together. 7. Isaac said to his father Abraham, "Father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." He said, "The fire and the wood are here, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" 8. Abraham said, "God himself will provide the lamb for a burnt offering, my son." So the two of them walked on together. 9. When they came to the place that God had shown him, Abraham built an altar there and laid the wood in order. He bound his son Isaac, and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. 10. Then Abraham reached out his hand and took the knife to kill his son. 11. But the angel of the LORD called to him from heaven, and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." 12. He said, "Do not lay your hand on the boy or do anything

to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from me." 13. And Abraham looked up and saw a ram, caught in a thicket by its horns. Abraham went and took the ram and offered it up as a burnt offering instead of his son. 14. So Abraham called that place "The LORD will provide"; as it is said to this day, "On the mount of the LORD it shall be provided."

## CLARIDGE CORNER



The Mentoring Program is planned at the beginning of each school year based upon the Claridge Primary School's calendar where an hour (2:00pm – 3:00pm) is set aside for about 20 or more Fridays for the mentors to interact with the students of Grade 6. We share our love through spiritual support and presentations on topical issues such as self esteem, values, character building, peer pressure, drugs, gangs, conflict resolution, etiquette, personal grooming, puberty and more. Presentations and discussions are done in a general assembly for all the Grade 6 students and/or in each class room. This new school year, (September 2008 to June, 2009) new topics were added such as the economic concerns and maintaining a healthy heart.

The number of mentors participating in the Program remained relatively constant during 2008 and they remained committed at various levels of participation. These faithful members are to be commended for their generosity and continued service. Sincerest gratitude is extended to all the presenters from various organizations and to our own Fr. Ferguson and Kyran Turnquest who made vivid presentations to the students on character building, self esteem and values. Every year Mrs. Vernice Cooper and Mrs. Beverley Wallace-Whitfield prepare the material for the etiquette presentation. The other members of the team are: Mrs. Olga Bethel, Mrs. Lorelda Burrows, Miss Nadia Campbell, Mrs. Disa Harper, Mrs. Leonie Lockhart, Mrs. Cecilia Askew, Miss Darcy Moss, Mrs. Ruthie Adderley, Patricia Fowler, Mr. Samuel Hall, and Mr. Winston Clarke.

Mrs. Mary Rodland joined the Program and has assisted by establishing a database of information on students (gathered from forms prepared by the mentors and completed by the students). The mentors intend to use this information to better assist the students and by extension their families. Mrs. Tressie Lynch also joined the team in January 2009. More men are needed and are invited to participate.

At the beginning of the new school year a meeting was held with the Principal, Mrs. Rose, Mrs. Chisolm, Vice Principal and Mr. Barr, School District Superintendent. At this meeting the new Principal and Vice Principal and the Superintendent were updated by Patricia Fowler on the Mentoring Program and they encouraged the continuation of the Program. They also expressed the following concerns and invited Holy Cross to work with them to find solutions:

- The academic standards were not at a satisfactory level and help is needed to raise the standards.
- Increased parental involvement is necessary for the students to improve the academic standards.
- The male students need special attention to reduce negative behaviour. Building the reading program at the school by reading to the students at specified times and donating cash and books.

The Principal also indicated that she would like to introduce the Mentoring Program to fifth grade students once per month.
