The First Lesson.....Mrs. Patricia Hermanns

Reader : A Reading from the Word of God written in Genesis 2:18-24

18. The LORD God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner." 19. So out of the ground the LORD God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name. 20. The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner. 21. So the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. 22. And the rib that the LORD God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man. 23. Then the man said, "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called Woman, for out of Man this one was taken." 24. Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh.

The Second Lesson.....Ms. Patricia Rolle

Reader: A Reading from the Word of God written in Hebrews 2:1-18

Therefore we must pay greater attention to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away from it. ² For if the message declared through angels was valid, and every transgression or disobedience received a just penalty, ³ how can we escape if we neglect so great a salvation? It was declared at first through the Lord, and it was attested to us by those who heard him, ⁴ while God added his testimony by signs and wonders and various miracles, and by gifts of the Holy Spirit, distributed according to his will. ⁵ Now God did not subject the coming world, about which we are speaking, to angels. ⁶ But someone has testified somewhere, "What are human beings that you are mindful of them, or mortals, that you care for them?" ⁷ You have made them for a little while lower than the angels; you have crowned them with glory and honor, ⁸ subjecting all things under their feet." Now in subjecting all things to them, God left nothing outside their control. As it is, we do not yet see everything in subjection to them, ⁹ but we do see Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone. ¹⁰ It was fitting that God, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through sufferings. ¹¹ For the one who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one Father. For this reason Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters, ¹² saying, "I will proclaim your name to my brothers and sisters, in the midst of the congregation I will praise you." ¹³ And again, "I will put my trust in him." And again, "Here am I and the children whom God

has given me." ^{14.} Since, therefore, the children share flesh and blood, he himself likewise shared the same things, so that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, ^{15.} and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by the fear of death. ^{16.} For it is clear that he did not come to help angels, but the descendants of Abraham. ^{17.} Therefore he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect, so that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the people. ^{18.} Because he himself was tested by what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested.

LIVING AN ABUNDANT LIFE

The author MP Dunleavy in her article “7 Smart ways to buy happiness” list seven ways we can spend money that can yield the biggest payoff both emotionally and financially.

Relationships: Studies indicate we're happiest when we feel connected to others. People with strong relationships tend to be happier and healthier, and live longer on average, according to psychologist Martin Seligman. Therefore, investing more in these bonds, like taking a friend to dinner, is beneficial.

Health: Buying good health by steady investments at regular intervals is the best way to see big gains. Paying to have regular medical and dental checkups is indispensable. Buying healthy foods like fruits, vegetables and vitamins, and going to exercise classes give a big payoff.

Time: A survey by Fortune magazine indicated most people would trade some of the money they make to have more time. Time is one asset that always seems to be in short supply.

Debt relief: Owing money downgrades your quality of life, creating so much stress that it may even make you sick or depressed, according to some studies. Cutting back spending and doing everything in your power to bring your debts down to zero is critical.

Giveaways: A surprise benefit of giving to others, or to a cause you believe in, is how good it makes you feel. Studies show that altruism not only tickles the feel-good centers in the brain, but it also creates a sense of social bonding and mutual support that enhances your personal well-being. You don't have to give millions to get that payoff.

Security: In an economic crisis like this one, it's tempting to stop putting money aside for the long term. However, making small, steady investments now can create double happiness: peace of mind now and greater wealth down the road.

Learning: Humans are born to grow. Research by psychologist Mihaly Csikszentmihalyi suggests we are often happiest when engaged in activities that challenge us and hold our focus.

When you start putting more money toward life (and less toward stuff), the net effect is more money saved, less debt and a sense of financial control and well-being and more happiness.
