THE CANDLE OF PREPARATION



The Opening Words:

Leader: John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus to come into the world. His call to repentance challenged his listeners to consider their relationship with God. They were to repent of their sins and then so discipline their lives that they would be ready to receive Him when He comes.

The Lighting of the First and Second Advent Candles:

(As the first purple candle is lighted, and a second of the same colour lighted)

Leader: Today, we relight the Candle of Expectation, reminding us of God’s great promise that He would send a Messiah to save His people. As we light the Candle of Preparation, it reminds us that as John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus, so we also need to prepare ourselves for His coming into our lives.

The Prayer:

All: Dear Lord, guide us in confessing our sinfulness to You. We know that out of the greatness of your love you have promised to forgive us. Cleanse us now as we prepare for the coming of Jesus again; this we ask in His name. **Amen.**

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. 2. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins. 3. A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. 4. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. 5. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken." 6. A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. 7. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the LORD blows upon it; surely the people are grass. 8. The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance. 10. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed. 11. A VIEW FROM THE PEW

This week the world recognised both World AIDS Day, as well as the International Day for Persons With Disabilities. These are significant to all of us because we all know and/or love someone who either suffers from HIV/AIDS or has a physical or mental disability. In paying attention to the plight of those who suffer with any of these, we realise how important it is to give God thanks in all things.

What should someone do who just found out they have contracted the deadly disease? Is that the end of the world for them? Do they deserve to have a negative stigma attached to them, and be quarantined for the rest of their lives? As Christians, it is our duty to truly live out the ways of Christ. Remember, it is he who sat amongst those considered the least in society and warned that the least that is done to any of them, it is done to him. First, there must be education and understanding about HIV/AIDS. Then, we can begin to set an example of the unconditional love of God, by showing those who are suffering that as long as there is life, there is hope. Bring your brothers and sisters in the human race to the knowledge of Christ, for He promised that he will hear the cry of all who repent and call on his name.

As for the disabled, this week I hosted a blind man and a quadriplegic on a talk show. Mr. Desmond Brown is blind, but he says it never hindered him from seeing all of the colors of the world, by tuning in to the hearts and spirits of mankind. Couldn't we learn from him? The quadriplegic is a sensational woman named Iris Adderley. We hosted her via the telephone, from her office at the Disability Affairs Division, where she is a consultant. She is a trained psychiatrist who thought her life was over after a terrible accident took away almost every motor function she had. She told us that she was ready to commit suicide. She said it was only the power of God that pulled her through to bask in her present day success. Had she given up at that point, she said, she would have stripped herself of the purpose in life she now serves, counseling others who suffer from disabilities in the Bahamas. The division's Assistant Director Charlamae Fernander said the Bahamas has a long way to go, because many places are still not disability friendly. She said it is her experience that those with disabilities aren't asking for a hand out, but a hand-up!

Let's give it to them by opening our hearts and minds to understanding that God's world is made up of so many different types of people. The only way to stand out, is to stand up for God.
