THE CANDLE OF PROCLAMATION



The Opening Words:

Leader: The prophets not only proclaimed that God would send His Son into the world, but they also foretold the rejoicing that would accompany His coming. The hearts of men, women and children were filled with joy and gladness as the realization of His promise drew near.

The Lighting of the First and Second and Third Advent Candles:

(As the first and second purple candles are relit, and as the third (pink) candle is lighted:)

Leader: Today, we relight the Candle of Expectation, recalling God's promise to send a Saviour to His people. As we relight the Candle of Preparation, we remember how John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus. Now, as we light the Candle of Proclamation, our hearts are filled with joy as we proclaim that His advent will soon take place.

The Prayer:

All: O God, we rejoice in the advent of Your Son and await the day when He will return. May our lives be filled with joy as You guide us in proclaiming His truth to those around us each day; in Christ's name we pray, Amen.

But be glad and rejoice forever in what I am creating; for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy, and its people as a delight. 19. I will rejoice in Jerusalem, and delight in my people; no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it, or the cry of distress. 20. No more shall there be in it an infant that lives but a few days, or an old person who does not live out a lifetime; for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth, and one who falls

This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.
