THE CANDLE OF REVELATION

The Opening Words:

Leader: The revelation of God’s love for human-kind is seen through the gift of His Son and on the first Christmas. We have learned what God is like through the life and teaching of Jesus, and we have discovered the true meaning of love through His death on our behalf.

The Lighting of the Four Advent Candles:

[As the three candles are relit, and the fourth candle is lighted, the leader says:]

Leader: Today, we relight the Candle of Expectation, recalling God’s promise to send a Saviour, and the Candle of Preparation, remembering John the Baptist preparing the way for Jesus, and the Candle of Proclamation, reminding us of the joy that comes from telling others of His coming. Now, as we light the Candle of Revelation, our lives are filled with the greatness of His love, revealed through the coming of the Christ -Child

The Prayer:

All: Father, we thank you for the manner in which you revealed yourself through Jesus and we praise you for the greatness of your love. Guide us during these final days of Advent, that the revelation of Your love may be seen by others in us, in Jesus’ name. Amen.
